Our Goal

The primary goal of healthcare interoperability is to support safe, secure, efficient, and quality care through an ecosystem of connected providers that conveniently and seamlessly shares high-quality data with the right people at the right time.

The Plan supports the strategic priority in the National Digital Health Strategy to deliver high-quality data with a commonly understood meaning that can be used with confidence.

- Health information is discoverable and accessible

- Promote the core use of the National **Health Services Directory**

Common meaning of health information

- Develop a standards catalogue to support easy search and retrieval of Agency specifications and associated
- The Agency to co-design specifications and use of standards with industry
- The Agency to promote the use of FHIR as part of its modernisation program
- Develop resources to support mapping between national and other common terminologies
