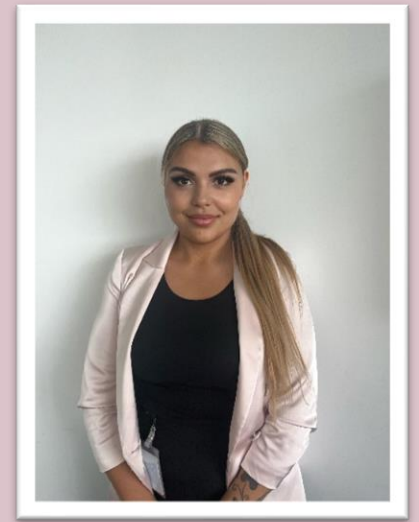


# Founder/President Welcome

*Yamma family, I am so incredibly honoured to lead, inspire and collaborate with such an amazing group of beautiful, strong, intelligent sister girls.*

Reflecting on LSBS's humble beginnings, our collective started with a simple conversation. There were a few Indigenous girls that I would bump into around campus, who were delighted to see another First Nations woman. A narrative that was often shared in these conversations reflected our experiences as Indigenous women at a large university... it often felt a bit isolating and lonely at times, especially for the girls that came into university, from all across Australia, knowing absolutely no one. I would always respond with an invitation to hang out with me and extend that invitation to meet some other like-minded girls

I knew. I identified a gap, illustrated by a lack of connection between our sisters within other faculties across UNSW. There were so many of us, but on a rare occasion perhaps a repercussion of COVID-19, we would cross paths and interact. This created a desire to host a girl's night, with my like-minded sister girls. So, I decided to gather a bunch of First Nations women, whom I met through all different stages of university, and have a girl's night over a nice dinner & fancy cocktail. We discussed our future goals in career, sport, and culture. The night was a great success, everyone felt connected, empowered, and elated. From this, I decided to create a mentoring program, that would continue facilitating these gatherings both in a social setting and cultural space which I decided to call Little Sister, Big Sister.



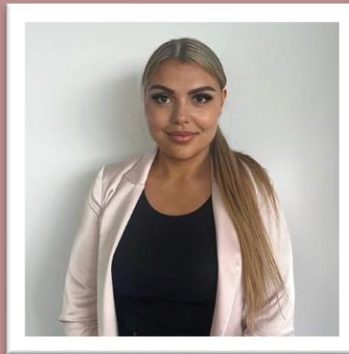

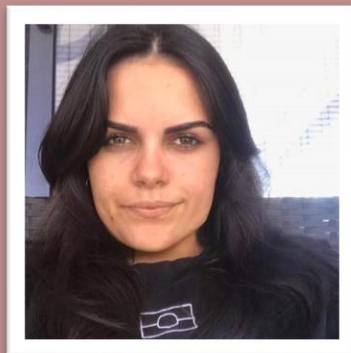

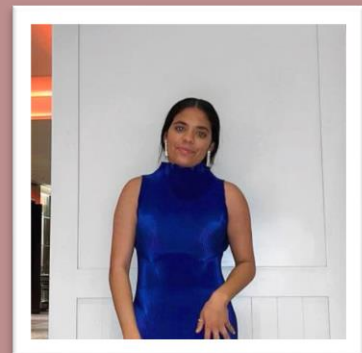
